## **Project profile**

MEDIADEM (European Media Policies Revisited: Valuing and Reclaiming Free and Independent Media in Contemporary Democratic Systems, <a href="www.mediadem.eliamep.gr">www.mediadem.eliamep.gr</a>) is a European research project that investigates the complex array of policy approaches and regulatory instruments that govern the media in 12 European Union (EU) Member States (Belgium, Bulgaria, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, Germany, Greece, Italy, Romania, Slovakia, Spain and the UK) and two EU candidate countries (Croatia and Turkey), exploring their impact on media freedom and independence. The project combines a country-based empirical study in each of the 14 countries under review with a comparative analysis across media sectors and various types of media services. Policy design and implementation are placed in the domestic socio-political context while external regulatory pressures deriving from the action of the European Union and the Council of Europe are also analysed in detail. The project seeks to identify those policy processes and tools that best promote media freedom and independence in Europe with the aim to formulate policy suggestions for the development of free and independent media addressing state and non-state actors at the national level, the EU and the CoE.

The project is a joint interdisciplinary effort of 14 partner institutions. It receives funding from the EU's Seventh Framework Programme (grant agreement FP7-SSH-2009-A no. 244365), with a three year duration, starting in April 2010. It is coordinated by the Hellenic Foundation for European and Foreign Policy (ELIAMEP) in Athens, Greece.

## **Final European conference in Brussels**

The aim of the final MEDIADEM conference in Brussels is to present the project's comparative research findings and to advance succinct policy recommendations for the development and consolidation of free and independent media in contemporary democratic societies. By bringing together representatives of the broader European media policy community, the media and its professionals and civil society associations active in the media field, the event seeks to support dialogue between the various stakeholders and heighten their awareness of the contribution they can make to media freedom and independence in Europe.
