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Facts about Switzerland and Berne



Switzerland

The small state of Switzerland (8.1 million inhabitants, 41,285 km²) lies in the heart of the European Alps. This central location between three important European cultures (German-speaking countries, France, Italy) is the reason for Switzerland's linguistic and cultural diversity. Four national languages coexist here – German, French, Italian and Romansh – each with its own flourishing culture. Every region cultivates its own customs and characteristics alongside its language.

Immigrants from all over the world, meanwhile, give Switzerland's cities a multicultural character. Switzerland is a typical migration country with around 24% of the permanent population coming mainly from European countries (primarily Italy, Germany and Portugal).

Switzerland consists of three main geographical regions: the Swiss Alps; the hilly Swiss Mittelland, which stretches from Lake Constance to Lake Geneva; and the Swiss Jura, an extended chain of fold mountains.

The Swiss Confederation became a federal state in 1848; today it consists of 26 cantons. The government is a collegial body (the Federal Council), formed of seven members. Parliament consists of two chambers which carry equal weight: the Council of States (representing the cantons) with 46 members, and the National Council (representing the population of the country as a whole) with 200 members.



Berne: the delightful Capital in the Heart of Switzerland

The Old Town of Berne is an architectural jewel – an urban treasure awarded UNESCO World Heritage Site status in 1983. Practically car-free with historic building façades, appealing boutiques, restaurants and cafés, it lends something altogether rare nowadays: a slower-paced, relaxed lifestyle. Six kilometres of arcades line the shopping streets of the Old Town, more than 27 museums guarantee a healthy cultural scene, and numerous national and international events ensure that there is a lot going on the whole year round. The way in which the leafy town blends into the surrounding region is unique. Where else can you swim around the Houses of Parliament or paddle past the city zoo in a rubber dinghy?

Berne's local mountain, the Gurten, is reachable in only 20 minutes from the city centre and offers fantastic views across the Alps and the Berne region. Many beautiful places that seem to be so far away are accessible as pleasant day trips. Thanks to its central location, Berne is the ideal base to discover the whole of Switzerland.

Swiss Climate and Seasons

The diversity of Switzerland is reflected in its climate, despite its small size. The Alps are an important factor here. They act as a barrier, so the weather in the north is often quite different from that in the south. It is noticeably milder in winter in the south than in the north.

The seasons are clearly defined. In spring (March to May) the trees blossom and the meadows become green. In summer the temperature rises to 25-30 degrees Celsius (77-86 degrees Fahrenheit). In autumn (September to November) the fruits ripen, then the leaves turn brown and fall. In winter, snow changes the landscape.

Meeting Venue and Accommodation



The meeting venue is the Kursaal of Berne

Under one roof, the Kursaal Berne comprises the 4-star Hotel Allegro, attractive restaurants and bars and the Grand Casino Berne.

The Kursaal Berne offers many attractive rooms for congresses and seminars.



Plenary room

Glass is a particular feature of the "Szenario 1 & 2" rooms, which are located on the 5th floor and offer panoramic views extending to the distant Alps.



Working group rooms

The "Bellavista rooms" enjoy a privileged location up on the 6th floor, and offer panoramic views extending over the historic old town of Berne to the distant Alps.

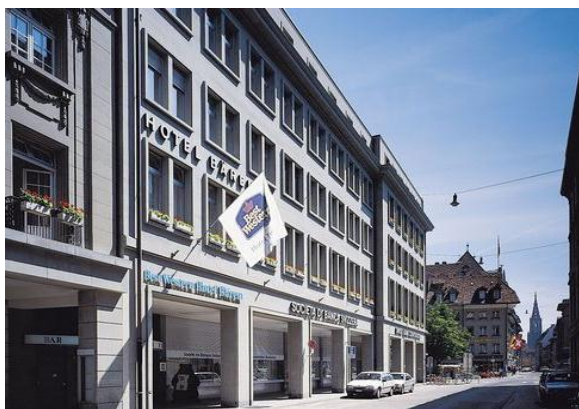

Air travel to Switzerland / transfer



Zurich International Airport

Travel time to/from Berne by train 1hr 18 min.

Two direct trains run every hour from Zurich airport to Berne's main railway station. The SBB travel centre is located below the Airport Centre in the Check-in 3 area.

Travel time to/from Berne by car/taxi approx. 1 ½ hours (very expensive, see p. 9).



Geneva International Airport

Travel time to/from Berne by train 1 hr 50 min.

Two direct trains run every hour from Geneva airport to Berne's main railway station. The railway station has direct access to the airport Check-in and Arrival levels.

Travel time to/from Berne by car/taxi approx. 2 hours (very expensive, see p. 9).



Basel Mulhouse EuroAirport

Travel time to/from Berne by bus/train approx. 1 hr 20 min.

The EuroAirport Basel does not have direct rail links, but there are connections by public transport to the railway stations in Basel with trains to Berne.

Travel Time to/from Berne by car/taxi approx. 1 ½ hours (very expensive, see p. 9).



Berne-Belp Airport

Travel time to/from Berne by car/taxi approx. 20 min. Travel time to/from Berne by bus/fast tram approx. 30 min.

The AirportBus runs every half hour from the airport to Belp fast tram station. The fast tram connects Belp and Berne's main railway station every fifteen minutes. The hotel's reservation confirmation serves as a transfer ticket from the airport to Berne's main railway station (see p. 7).

Onward travel to Berne from the airport



Zurich, Geneva and Basel Airports

We recommend that you travel from the airport by rail and will provide a 2nd class return rail ticket. If you require such a rail ticket, please indicate this on the registration form. If you require 1st class you must pay the surcharge (CHF 76.00). Two direct regional trains an hour run to Berne from all 3 airports. At Zurich and Geneva airports the SBB rail station is inside the airport building itself.

Please note that the last trains operate as follows:

Zurich Airport - Berne 23.37/Geneva Airport - Berne 22.47/Basel Central Station - Berne 23.37

Berne-Belp Airport

The hotel's reservation confirmation serves as a transfer ticket from Berne-Belp Airport to Berne's main railway station. Travellers choosing Berne-Belp Airport do not need a rail ticket.

Important: On arrival at the airports (in the arrivals hall) please contact our colleagues (wearing an EPRA badge). They will give you the rail tickets and provide detailed information about your onward journey to Berne (please retain your outward rail ticket for your return journey to the airport).

Taxis are not recommended for the long distance from Zurich, Geneva and Basel airports, as taxis are very expensive in Switzerland. However, if you do choose this variant, you must pay the costs. Costs (individual) approx. CHF 350 – 550.

Direct rail travel to Berne (no flight)

Switzerland and the Berne venue are also excellently served by rail from anywhere in Europe.



Rail

Thanks to high-speed connections to Germany, Italy, France and Austria, more distant destinations can also be reached comfortably by train.

The destination station is Berne's main station.

Arrival at Berne's main rail station

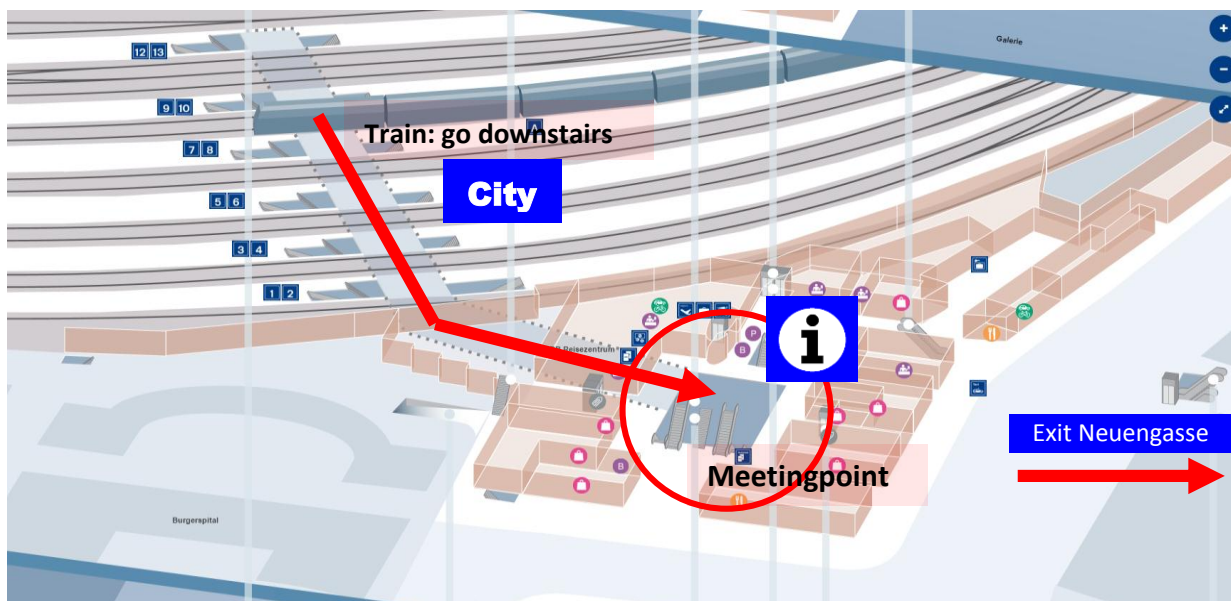
On Wednesday all day and Thursday morning, on arrival at the station our assistants at the meeting point in the station hall will be happy to help you transfer to your hotel and provide you with more information. After leaving the train, please don't go upstairs, instead go down the stairs or the ramp. Then follow directions to the city to the station concourse (Meetingpoint). Free shuttle buses are available to take you to the hotel or the venue for the event. In the case of arrivals after 20:00 we can provide individual solutions.

If you should have any queries or concerns, our information and help desk are available at the Kursaal Berne from Wednesday evening until Friday noon. If you cannot find your way at the main station, please contact the helpline on +41 79 606 57 46 which is for this purpose only.

From Berne's main station the hotels and the venue can also be reached within a short time by taxi, tram or on foot. The hotel's reservation confirmation serves as a transfer ticket by tram. You will find a detailed city plan with the most important locations at the end of the documentation. The easiest way to get to the hotels and the venue on foot is via the "Neuengasse" exit from the station.

Return journey:

After the official end of the meeting we will provide shuttle buses transfers from the Kursaal venue to Berne's main rail station (at approx. 14:30).

Otherwise individuals should organise their own return journey. Berne's main rail station can be reached within a short time on foot, by tram or by taxi. The Berne Ticket, which is included in the hotel price, entitles the user to travel by tram in the centre of Berne.

Tramline 9 from hotels/Kursaal direction station → Direction "Wabern"

The rail ticket used on arrival is also valid for the return journey from Berne's main rail station to Zurich, Geneva and Basel airports.

Travel documents and visa requirements

Travel document requirements

Please note that Switzerland is part of the Schengen Area. Citizens from Schengen Member states may enter Switzerland by presenting a valid passport or identity card.

In general, all third-country nationals, regardless of their visa obligation status, who wish to enter the Schengen Area through Switzerland must be in possession of a travel document that meets both of the following two requirements:

- The validity of the travel document must extend at least three months after the intended date of departure from the Schengen Area; and
- The travel document must have been issued within the previous 10 years.

The date of issue of the travel document shall be the determining factor, notwithstanding any decision by the authorities to extend the period of validity of the travel document.

A) Third country nationals in possession of both a valid residence permit issued by a Schengen member state or a valid type D visa and a recognized travel document are exempt from visa requirements.

B) Holders of a diplomatic passport are exempt from visa requirements if they wish to enter Switzerland: on an official mission or for other travel purposes without exercising a gainful occupation.

C) Holders of a diplomatic or service passport are exempt from visa requirements if they wish to enter Switzerland: on an official mission or for other travel purposes without exercising a gainful occupation.

D) Holders of a diplomatic, service or special passport are exempt from visa requirements if they wish to enter Switzerland: on an official mission or for other travel purposes without exercising a gainful occupation.

Foreign Currency Exchange

Please note that Switzerland remains with the Swiss franc, usually indicated as CHF. While Switzerland is not part of the European Union and thus is not obliged to convert to the Euro, many prices are nonetheless indicated in euros so that visitors may compare prices. Merchants may accept euros but are not obliged to do so. Change given back to the client will most likely be in Swiss francs.

The safest and easiest form of money are traveler's checks and credit cards. The cards most used are American Express, MasterCard and Visa.

Many banks in Switzerland have equipped their ATM machines with the CIRRUS or MAESTRO system. Many other Swiss banks offer ATM machines for cash advances with your credit card. It is recommended to have a small amount of cash on hand upon arrival in Switzerland for immediate expenses, i.e. taxis, city transportation etc.

Business Hours:

Banks are usually open Monday to Friday from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. However, money can also be changed at the train stations. Look for the "Change/Cambio" signs.

During your stay in Berne the shops are open as follows:

Wednesday: 09:00 to 17:00

Thursday closed (Ascension Day)

Friday: 09:00 to 18.30

Saturday: 08:00 to 17:00

The hotels can be paid in cash, by credit card (locally) or by invoice. In addition, a handling charge of CHF 25.00 per invoice will be charged to the participant.

Additional costs (excursions, rail ticket upgrade, etc.) can be paid locally in cash (CHF), by credit card (Visa or MasterCard) or as a pre-payment before the meeting (IBAN).

Other attractions in Berne



Clock Tower (Zytglogge)

Today it is one of Bern's most important sights. The ornate astronomical clock with its moving figures was built in 1530. It served as the city's main clock and thus had an authoritative function in Bern.



House of Parliament

The Parliament Building is the seat of the Swiss government (Federal Council) and the parliament (National Council and Council of States). The building was completed in 1902. The central domed hall and both chambers feature numerous symbolic renderings of Swiss history.



The Bear Park

A visit to the Bear Park is a special experience for children as well as adults. Paths run through the park down to the Aare riverside path, giving visitors great insight into the lives of the bears. They can watch the bears play, bathe and climb right in front of their eyes.



Gurten – Bern's local mountain

Since the opening of the park in 1999, Bern's local mountain, the Gurten, has been delighting visitors from near and far with its relaxed atmosphere.



Zentrum Paul Klee

The world's most important Klee collection, the Zentrum Paul Klee, displays its some 4,000 works through changing exhibits organized around different themes.
