Examines the implications of the shift of political electoral advertising to the internet

Depicts electoral spending

**Exposes questionable advertising techniques** 

Indicates areas where electoral and media legislation should be revisited and reinforced

### OUTPUT 3

Shows that while female politicians in general receive less media attention than their male counterparts, their gender is frequently the focus of debate

Study on a standard-setting instrument on media coverage of elections with a specific focus on gender equality

Indicates that the electoral messages are framed mostly by male journalists, editors and experts

Advocates the need to mainstream gender equality and incorporate it in all aspects of media coverage of elections

Establishes clearly the obligations of states

Advocates **transparency** 

Lists responsibilities of intermediaries

Study on the human rights dimensions of algorithms

human rights dimensions of automated data processing techniques and possible regulatory implications

Concludes that all rights are potentially affected because the growing use of automation and algorithmic decision-making

Identifies possible regulatory options notably for public entities (redress for individuals, consumer protection)

Lays the ground for a follow-up study on different forms of artificial intelligence
