- No legal obligations related to MIL
- Sporadic activities
- Cooperation with numerous partners
- Main focus on protection of minors from inappropriate content in avms and online safety (CRA is a convergent regulator)
- In-house expertise on MIL







Department for Content and Media Literacy

- In October 2019 a new department for Media Content and Media Literacy has been created within the CRA
- 3 persons working on this topic
- one of the first steps has been setting-up an informal MIL network



- 1. Mapping of institutions and organizations active in the field of MIL
- 2. Creation of a database
- 3. Communication with other big stakeholders active in this field aimed at including previous initiatives of cooperation and creation of a single network offer for partnership
