Aim: 

- Facilitate **practical discussions** between EPRA members on implementation of regulation (and co-regulation) of VSPs
- Invite **selected academics** to enrich discussions and for an interplay with theory and practice
- **Learn from each other** and explore concrete problems

 **Deliverable:** *Detailed summary of sessions + presentations*

Format: 

- A series of **informal workshops** every 4-5 months
- Brief **online sessions** (120 minutes max)
- Presentation by **experts** on key topics
- **Open discussion** with EPRA members

The VSP & Regulation Workshops today:

- Inaugural launch: 21 October 2021
- Open group for EPRA members (≠ EMIL & AI group)
- 3 Workshops so far

Topics addressed:

➤ Protection of minors: 16 March (age assurance & age verification)

- Update on national developments on age assurance and age verification systems (Ofcom-UK, Arcom-FR, lFM-DE) and on age rating systems (KAVI-FI, CvdM-NL).
- euCONSENT consortium (aim at designing an open, secure and certified age verification and parental consent system) *by Sonia Livingstone (LSE)* and a focus on data protection and children's rights *by Eva Lievens (Ghent University)*

➤ Challenges and highlights:

- AI tools may help provide more robust age verification systems
- Implementation obstacles:
 - No official notification or unclear jurisdiction over VSPs
 - The lack of level-playing field and harmonisation put forward as an excuse by adult VSPs for not complying

Key messages:

- **More cooperation** between NRAs (*implementation support, jurisdiction over adult services*)
- Technical measures must **empower children** and reflect the reality of **family life**
- All measures shall respect **children's rights and privacy**
- Policy-making and implementation should **involve children**

Topics addressed:

➤ *Hate speech: a systemic approach: 29 June*

- The Carnegie Project: a public policy proposal to improve the safety of internet services' users via a systemic and safety-by-design approach, *by Lorna Woods (University of Essex) and William Perrin (Carnegie UK)*

➤ *Challenges & highlights:*

- The need of a **shift of mindset** from an ex-post content regulation to an ex-ante safety-by-design approach
- The issue of **harmful but non-criminal content**
- **Political involvement** and government interference

Key messages:

- A **victim-focused approach** is important, with all categories of victims
- Such a systemic approach **can be used for other types of content**
(gender violence...)
- A **regular assessment and monitoring** of the system is needed
- **Remedies and answers** to hate speech must be proportional
