**Divina Frau-Meigs** 

Divina Frau-Meigs, Professor of media and information and communications technology sociology at the <u>Université</u> <u>Sorbonne Nouvelle</u>, France.

<u>Divina Frau-Meigs</u> is a renowned professor of media and information and communications technology sociology at the Université Sorbonne Nouvelle, France. She holds several degrees from the Sorbonne University, Stanford University and the Annenberg School for Communications at the University of Pennsylvania.

Specialised in internet governance, media and information literacy and risky content and behaviour (violence, pornography, information...), she is also a researcher in the media uses and practices (cultural diversity, education, identity...) and has published many articles and books in national and international publications.

She holds the UNESCO chair "Savoir-devenir in sustainable digital development" and founded, in 2016, the association "Savoir\*Devenir" to give citizens back the power over their media and digital life. She was also the coordinator of many media literacy projects (TRANSLIT, the European project MOOC ECO, YOUCHECK!...).

An expert for the European Union, the Council of Europe, UNESCO and a number of governments and institutions, she also represents civil society interests in the Internet Governance Forum and in other global arenas.

In a recent article, Divina analyses the benefits and risks raised by the fight against disinformation in the field of media literacy and journalism (<a href="How Disinformation Reshaped the Relationship between">How Disinformation Reshaped the Relationship between</a>
<a href="Journalism and Media and Information Literacy">Journalism and Media and Information Literacy</a> (MIL): Old and New Perspectives Revisited — 14 June 2022).

As our keynote speaker, Divina will present her analysis of the impact of disinformation on the relationship between Journalism and Media and Information Literacy.

## Anja Van Boven, Coordinator at KWB, BE (Flanders)

Anja works for KWB, a Flemish sociocultural organisation whose mission it is to create social, committed, inclusive and solidary neighbourhoods.

Created 75 years ago, KWB covers around 500 neighbourhoods in Flanders and Brussels, thanks to more than 50.000 volunteers.

For several years she has been organising several activities together with all the volunteers of KWB, such as cooking class,

cycling tour, company visit or workshop.

As of June, she is working as a staff coordinator.

Anja will present a new project of KWB, the "Halloween Horror tour", aimed at building awareness about truth and false news among children.
