



The new media landscape




 Print and broadcast now coexist with platforms, influencers and AI

- Algorithms now play a key role in shaping what audiences - particularly younger users - see
- Boundaries become blurry: traditional, nontraditional, professional and non-professional actors coexist in the new media landscape



Key threats in the digital age



Platform and opaque algorithms – who decides what gets to be seen?

Disinformation, filter bubbles, echo chambers, news deserts

Changing business models: economic pressures put sustainable journalism at risk




Legal & policy frameworks



- **EU and Council of Europe:** new laws and standards for digital pluralism aiming to guarantee the editorial independence of news media and the access of users to plural sources of information.
- An evolving legal framework:
 - European Media Freedom Act (EMFA)
 - Digital Services Act (DSA)




Safeguarding editorial independence



- EMFA protects journalists and news outlets against political interference, enshrines in law the rights of news providers
- It also introduces transparency and accountability requirements for news media outlets



Al and the future of news



- Al tools change the industry, drastically lowering costs and bringing about new types of formats...
- ... but they introduce new risks: deepfakes, more fake news, etc.
- Managing the positive and the negative:
 Al can be a game changer for the better, if used to focus on quality and trust





Ongoing challenges and what's next

Importance of balancing economic viability, innovation and trust

 Continuous adaptation is needed: new actors, new technologies and evolving audience behaviours



Key takeaways



- Pluralism remains essential, but it must evolve and must be capable of adaptation in the digital age
- New threats call for permanent vigilance
- Regulation, innovation and support for journalism all play a part in enabling a pluralistic media sector






On the institutional side...



- New Executive Director: Ms. Pauline Durand-Vialle succeeded to Ms. Susanne Nikoltchev as of Sept. 2025
- Ukraine joins the Observatory as the 42nd member of its Executive Council as of June 2025
- Next Presidency of the Observatory: Norway will succeed Austria as the new Chair of the Observatory from Jan. 2026




Next to come early in 2026...


