

#### Painting a picture


- In a future world, the consumer will control what he/she watches
  - Recommendations from friends, etc.
- What is watched will depend on the device and "viewing situation"
  - Mobile, Fixed, Personal.
- This will require a plurality of devices and access networks

## Broat and

- Broadcasters are some of the biggest users of broadband
  - BBC's iPlayer consumer c.15% of Internet traffic in UK
- To address quality issues with European Internet infrastructures, broadcasters are major innovators in this area
- Wireless broadband is an integral part of a broadband offering



### Wireless Broadband & Spectrum

- Increased public scrutiny of the use of spectrum will improve its efficiency
  - Analogue Switch-off will be completed by 2012-2015
  - 2G networks should all be migrated to 3G/LTE
- Broadcasting and Broadband have to co-exist
  - Interference issues are non-negligible but can be addressed in partnership
- Wouldn't it be great if we could all innovate on wireless broadband networks as well?

# Can Wireless Broadband replace Broadcasting?

- Public Service Broadcasters have a universal coverage obligation
  - Terrestrial broadcast networks address this obligation efficiently
  - Broadcasters pay lots of money for distribution
- Current proposals for wireless broadband appear to reinforce today's economic models
  - Broadcast network operators and service providers have been separated for some time

# Can Wireless Broadband replace Broadcasting?

- Were wireless broadband networks to
  - address universal coverage,
  - employ a FTA model and
  - be competitively priced

#### Why not!

Unfortunately, we don't see this happening anytime soon.
